The Galapagos Frigate birds are very special! We called our pair Mr and Mrs Finchley. Mr Finchley shows off his bright red plumage to all the lady Frigate birds. Mrs Finchley is bigger than her husband but they are both fantastic flyers. They are very light so can stay in the sky for days, weeks, or even years by just stretching their wings and gliding! They do not have waterproof wings so cannot land on water to catch fish. They either eat flying fish or are 'pirates' and steal fish from the blue footed booby birds. Frigate boats are boats of war.
